## ORTON-GILLINGHAM LEVELS OF TRAINING

Trainees can apply for **Certification with The Orton-Gillingham Academy (OGA)** at the following levels:

- Classroom Educator, Associate Practitioner (A or B), Certified, or Fellow after completing required training courses and practicum.

The CLASSROOM EDUCATOR is qualified to apply the principles of the Orton-Gillingham Approach to modify and provide literacy instruction for the classroom or small groups ONLY within the school setting (Tier 1). **REQUIREMENTS:** 

Fundamentals + Classroom Educator + 50 hr. practicum (5 class observations)

**ASSOCIATE** A member is qualified to provide 1:1 Orton-Gillingham instruction under the mentorship of an Academy Fellow (Tier 3). **REQUIREMENTS:** 

Fundamentals + Associate + 100 hr practicum (10 observations 1:1)

ASSOCIATE B member is qualified to provide 1:1 as well as group Orton-Gillingham instruction under the mentorship of an Academy Fellow (Tier 3). \*recommended for classroom teachers who wish to provide remedial support **REQUIREMENTS:** 

Fundamentals + Associate + Classroom Educator + 100 hour practicum (50 hours / 5 observations in classroom; 50 hours / 5 observations 1:1)

The CERTIFIED member is qualified as an independent practitioner in the Orton-Gillingham Approach (Tier 3).

#### **REQUIREMENTS:**

Fundamentals + Associate + 100 hr practicum (A or B) + Certified + 200 hr practicum (10 observations 1:1)

**SYNCHRONOUS INSTRUCTION** takes place in real-time either in-person or using ZOOM. **ASYNCHRONOUS INSTRUCTION:** Between classes, trainees are responsible for completing Independent Learning Modules (ILMs). ILMs may include: readings, pre-recorded lectures, videos, reflections, lesson planning, or other activities.

OGA has MINIMUM standards, curriculum and hours required for any course leading to certification. Fellows can require more coursework hours or practicum hours or observations at their discretion.

#### **FUNDAMENTALS** course —

This introductory course is a PREREQUISITE for all other training.

It provides an overview of the processes underlying literacy development; current research in the fields of reading, writing, spelling, and dyslexia; the scientific study of language and its structure; and introduces the O-G approach.

It is the only the **FIRST PART** of the Classroom Educator or Associate level training and is not meant to be taken in isolation without further study.

**COURSEWORK**: 45 hours synchronous + 45 hours asynchronous

### CLASSROOM EDUCATOR course —

This seminar is specifically designed to equip teachers with tools and resources to deliver beginning literacy instruction in the classroom. Trainees walk away with a multitude of materials and ideas to use in the classroom, small groups or with individual students! Utilizing direct instruction, teachers bring a multisensory, structured, sequential, phonics and linguistic approach into the mainstream classroom. Trainees who wish to provide remedial support need to take the Associate Practitioner course.

**Prerequisite:** Fundamentals

**COURSEWORK**: 8 hours synchronous + 2 hours asynchronous **Practicum:** 50-hours; 5 observations in classroom over 8 months

### ASSOCIATE PRACTITIONER course —

This course consists of a more in-depth immersion in the linguistic structure of language, with additional coursework in assessment and profile development, diagnostic and prescriptive teaching, in-depth student error analysis, vocabulary, morphology and etymology, the history of English, basic grammar, as well as practice in designing and delivering O-G lessons.

**Prerequisite:** Fundamentals

**COURSEWORK:** 45 hours synchronous + 40 hours asynchronous **Practicum:** 100 hours; 10 observations over 8 months (minimum).

# **CERTIFIED training** —

This advanced coursework includes topics such as current research, study of the brain, dyslexia and related difficulties, language structure, writing, grammar, morphology, etymology, assessment, error analysis, organization and study skills, technology, and O-G in other subject areas.

**Prerequisite:** Completion of ALL Associate level coursework, assignments & practicum. **COURSEWORK**: 100 hours (a variety of options available - please contact to discuss) **Practicum:** 200 hours; 10 observations over 2 years (minimum)
